Minutes of the Meeting of Wyeside Group Parish Council, held via Zoom Platform (during Covid 19 virus pandemic), on Wednesday 4th November 2020 from 7.30 pm

In attendance on Zoom were:

The first Zoom session ran from 7.30 - 8.10 and the second session from 8.15 to 8.48 pm

Cllr Dale welcomed everyone to the Meeting.

1. Open Session with any parishioners who have joined the Zoom Meeting

No items were raised in the Open Session.

2. Apologies for absence

There were apologies received from Cllrs B. Bowen, S Russell, J. Darbyshire, H. Light, D. Roper, C. Chu and O. Whittall. Cllrs A. Smith and J. Hughes were not present.

Cllr W. Whittall had tendered his resignation from the Parish Council. A "thank you" was recorded to Will for his work and time as councillor for Moccas within the Wyeside Group.

3. Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest recorded.

4. To approve previous minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 7th October 2020

The minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council, held on 7th October 2020, were approved as a true and correct record of the meeting.

It was commented that the public right of way in the vicinity of the Ploughfields planning application was being re-routed. Legal confirmation of the status of the public right of way was highlighted and the Ward Cllr Jennie Hewitt would look into this. The size of the drainage pipe on the same planning location was commented as being believed to be "inadequate" for the anticipated volume.

5. Report of North Ward Councillor

Ward Cllr. Hewitt had circulated her report.

6. <u>To consider response to Planning Applications, as notified, and then determined by Herefordshire Council</u>

There were no new applications for consideration of comments.

7. <u>Lengthsman To advise of works for the Lengthsman</u>

The Lengthsmen had carried out the Public Right Of Way foot bridge repairs at Bredwardine, cleared the overgrowth of vegetation on the same bridge and had fitted a new stile adjacent to the Bredwardine River Wye crossing bridge. They have also carried out grip and gully clearance around all of the five group parishes and cleared round the road signs. To continue with seasonal upkeep works as required.

8. Roads and Greens

8.1) To report on highway, greens and related issues

The damage being done to the Blakemere Green would be revisited. This would likely be when the forthcoming lockdown period had been lifted.

8.2) Consideration of request for bus shelter at Moccas Cross – to gather thoughts

It was agreed that feedback on this topic from Moccas councillors was required and it would be carried forward to a later agenda.

9. Footpaths and Trees - update

Cllr Jeff Newsome advised that he knew of a number of places where finger posts and way markers were missing, the latter because there were no posts to fix them to. Cllr Newsome would send a full list of requirements to the Clerk to begin the process of replacement etc. Cllr Newsome advised that he was working on a footpath issue from Preston on Wye to Lower Chilstone, Madley.

10. Community Crisis and Community Resilience

The Clerk had have tracked down the Community Resilience Form and Information relating to completion of the document. These had been circulated and would be kept "in sight".

A resident had drawn the council's attention to a leaflet that had been placed inside (three of) the parish notice boards. Any leaflet found to be out of date would also be removed and also if there were not to be sufficient room for parish council information excess notices would also be removed.
