

# Police Briefing Wednesday 31st October 2012 South Herefordshire & Golden Valley

## Allensmore

Two windows of a tractor were broken, possibly by an air weapon, between 12 noon and 5pm on Wednesday 24th October. The tractor was parked in a yard by the side of a minor road, not far from Clehonger.

## Clehonger

A shed on a farm in the village was entered sometime between the evening of Saturday 27th October and the morning of Tuesday 30th October. An Ingersol Rand compressor and a Truecraft welder were among items stolen.

A 17 year old male from the village was arrested in Hereford on Tuesday 30th October for being in possession of an offensive weapon in a public place. He was given a reprimand.

## Kingstone

A blue Ford transit tipper truck **T\*24BJR** was seen driving around the Dene Industrial Estate at around 1.30pm on Monday 22nd October. The vehicle appeared to be laden with scrap. The same vehicle had been stopped a week previously in a joint operation and prosecuted for not having a Waste Carriers Licence! The enforcement team have been notified.

A metal garage door that had been taken off and cut in half for easy transportation to the tip was stolen during the day on Tuesday 30th October. It had been left against the fence of the property in the village, the occupiers had been approached on several occasions by a male asking if he could have it but they told him they would be removing it themselves.

A 14 year old male from the village was arrested on Saturday 27th October and charged with assault and intimidating witnesses . He will be appearing in court in the near future.

## Newton St Margarets

A shed next to a property was broken into between the 11th and 22nd October. A quantity of power tools including a Makita angle grinder and belt sander, a Bosch angle grinder and a Milwauki power drill were stolen.

## Orcop

Between 11am and 2pm on Tuesday 30th October, an orange Echo HCA-265E hedge cutter was stolen from a front porch of a property just outside Orcop Hill.

A 26 year old male from the village was arrested for providing a positive breath test in Hereford at 1.25am on 27th October. He will be appearing in court shortly.

### Peterchurch

A 21 year old female from the village was arrested for assault on 28th October. She was given a caution.

### Urishay

A barn next to a property was entered overnight on 26th/27th October, and a shed within the barn had been entered and the padlock taken. There was nothing inside the shed, but 18 months ago there had been a break in to the same shed and several electrical items were stolen. It could be that the offenders returned to have another go.

Just along the road from the above incident, several metal barns in a field had also been entered, using what appears to be an angle grinder to cut the locks off. This premises had been targeted before, at the same time as the property mentioned above, and several items had been stolen. This time, nothing of value had been left in the barns and the suspects left empty-handed.
